
Getting Here

Adventure for Everyone

With its endless hiking and biking opportunities, Lake Butler is the perfect destination for those who love the outdoors. Why not start out by driving through our natural woodlands a wonderful experience, especially for visitors from urban centers. Note that there is no charge for using the lake or accessing our wonderful trails and nature areas. You will need to bring your own equipment, however, since there are no rental facilities in Lake Butler.



Palatka State Trail - Cycling, Hiking, Jogging

One of the best ways to explore the Union County and its breathtaking North Florida wilderness is to walk along Lake Butler's multi-use trail, which is full of natural fauna and wildlife. Abundant wildlife including white-tailed deer, moccasin snakes, and even alligators can be sighted in the heavily wooded area surrounding the trail.

This route, which runs parallel to the former Norfolk-Southern Railroad, is a part of the Rail to Trails program that connects regions all through our state. It's perfect for one-day adventures, bike rides and relaxing strolls. Our trail is relatively flat—its elevation change is only about 100 feet which makes it accessible to just about everyone. Benches along the trail make perfect resting spots from which to appreciate the lush surroundings. Hunting



Museum and History

Union Country Historical Museum

Union County Historical Museum: Lake Butler was chartered 125 years ago. Our Union County Historical museum displays relics and artifacts that capture the city's deep roots in the American south.

The museum's main room contains some unique pieces Lake Butler's history, including military uniforms, vintage medical supplies, and early 19th century agriculture equipment such as plows and devices to grind cane sugar.
